As of the most recent report (June 23, 2020) District 2-S3 has contributed \$6,120 to the Texas Lions Foundation. That amount is 7.5 % of the total contributed in the State and placed 2-S3 fourth among 16 Districts—only three Districts contributed more than 2-S3. **THANK YOU** for your continued support of, and dedication to, the Texas Lions Foundation.

At the TLF Board Meeting held Friday, June 26, a Humanitarian Grant request from the Canyon Lake Lions Noon Club was approved in the amount of \$10,000. That grant will assist the Club with necessary funding for installation of a playground shade as part of a children's playground being constructed in Canyon Lake.

Based on his enthusiastic support of the Texas Lions
Foundation this past year, PDG Larkin has qualified
for the Ed Flood Award presented to District Governors who secure total contributions equal to at least

DISTRICT 2S3 2020-2021 GOALS

1 REJUVENATE OUR DISTRICT WITH NEW CLUBS

GOAL: ADD TWO NEW CLUBS DURING NEXT YEAR.

We need to identify an area in the suburbs of North Austin to locate a club. It can be any type of club but with the demographics of the area, a specialty club of some type might work best. Equal consideration should be given to areas in the southpart of the District between South Austin and New Braunfels, possibly in the I35 corridor.

Guidance items:

- 1. Early in the year we will establish a working group with 2 committees. A North committee and a South Committee. These groups will work under and with the Governor team, NAMI Champion and GMT.
- 2. The committee timelines will be to have possible locations and recommendations ready for leadership by September 1, 2020.
- 3. Following the receipt of recommendations, the Leadership along with the Committee Chairs will select the focus location, determine the club type and establish a timeline for the formation of new clubs.
- 4. All information and preparation for the charter should be in place by February 1, 2021. The committee timelines will be to have possible locations and
 - 2 REVITALIZE OUR CLUBS WITH NEW MEMBERS

GOAL: THE ASSIGNED MEMBERSHIP GOAL FOR EVERY DISTRICT IS TO BE +1 FROM THE FINAL DISTRICT MEMBERSHIP ON JUNE 30, 2020. THAT GOAL WILL BE THE ONE WE FOLLOW.

Education and promotion will key the goal of new membership in our existing club.

- 1. The District IT program will emphasize communication of information to encourage and support membership. A specific goal is to increase the memberships' use of our IT program. The measurement is the report provided by District IT Duane Lueders after each month.
- 2. The District IT program and other leadership will encourage clubs to keep club information current on their websites, Facebook, and other social media sites that might be used by clubs.
- 3. The District IT program with support of a social media specialist will promote the activities of our Lion members on the District Facebook page.
- 4.. We will promote education through the training provided by our district GLT. The training goal is to have 60% of the Club Officers in the District trained about their office by October 31, 2020 We will inform members through various message types about the availability of educational material in the Lions Learning center.
- 5. We will train and support the work of our zone chairs. We will keep the Zone chairs informed about the status of their clubs and the things that are needed to accomplish our membership goal.
- 6. We must focus on retention. We can emphasize new members but we cannot do things that cause us to lose members that we already have The specific retention goal is to reduce drops in our District by 5% from the number that were dropped in 2019-2020.

We need to encourage our new member sponsors they need to know their work is not done at the new member initiation. Their work is just beginning. Sponsors need to ensure their new members find a home in the club and find things to do to be involved.

We as club members and club leaders need to be aware of the membership of our clubs. We need to recognize a member that is failing in attendance and participation. We need to make special emphasis to gt them involved. Secretaries need to track attendance and participation.

Leadership in clubs must let new members or different members take leadership roles in projects, offices, or other things that are part of a club's program.

3 MOTIVATE MEMBERS WITH NEW FELLOWSHIPS AND EXCITING SERVICE

GOAL: 60% OF THE CLUBS IN OUR DISTRICT WILL CONDUCT AND REPORT TO LCI AT LEAST TWO MEANINGFUL SERVICE PROJECTS IN THE AREAS OF LCI GLOBAL CAUSES.

Our clubs need to be aware of new ideas. That is why reporting is such a critical part of the LCI program. Each clubs' reporting is available to other clubs. Members using the reporting features of our LCI program can held other clubs find ideas for new service projects.

Leaders need to be willing to listen to new members for ideas. This helps with the task of getting new members involved in club activities.

Fellowship is also important. We have at least two avenues of fellowship our regular meetings and special events.

- 1. We need to ensure our regular meetings are conducted in an organized and timely way Organization and order is very good for the morale of the club.
- 2. We can have special events to stimulate togetherness, recognize members, etc. We need to use these opportunities as club leaders.


This pandemic has forced a lot of the clubs to reconsider a lot of what the clubs did service wise, social wise and fundraising. All areas have been affected by the new normal. Masks, hand sanitation and temperature checks are the new normal in the workplace and if your club meets there are 9 counties (in our District) regulating how each meeting or event gathering must comply to meet.

Training this year for all club officers was also affected. Training for this Lions Year will be virtual workshops and or classes presented either by Zoom or Go to Meeting. Both software are available from the District for the use of our clubs should they decide to meet virtual. Training for our club officers was the first test and challenge we had to face from May through the present. If you held the same club officer position last Lions year (2019-2020) that you hold today, you were exempt from training in that position. Training is required for all club officers new to the position that they hold for 2020-2021. As of August 1, 2020, we still need 95 club officers to complete their training. The clubs that achieve 60% or better of their officers completing their specific training will be recognized by the District Governor.

Additionally, since this is a year to plan the club's future the following advanced training has been added and is open to Club Presidents, First Vice Presidents, Membership Chairs, Service Chairs. These officers specifically are called the club's Global Action Team (GAT). There are 4 to 5 workshops planned for this group. Each Club that completes all the workshops and submits to the Zone Chairs and GLT_D their plans, will earn a banner patch for their club this year to be awarded at the District Convention in the Spring of 2021.

If you want specific training, please go to the District website under Global Leadership and contact me direct to be included in some training. I have had a request for Certified Guiding Lion Training, and I will be presenting it once a quarter. "How to Become a District Officer" presentation will be considered for January 2021.

2020-2021 is year of uncertainty and profound change. Your Lions Clubs must meet to plan out the future. Planning is forced on us whether we like it or not. Do not allow this situation to kill your club by not meeting and planning. We (At the District) know there are clubs that are not meeting. We strongly encourage all our clubs to meet at least virtually at first then, as the rules change, back to in person. The situation calls for flexibility to have more than one plan as we have seen in the past three months. All our classes and workshops are recorded and will be available on the <u>District Training</u> Webpage.

Important things to remember if your club is conducting a Peace Poster Contest

- Order kits for each contest you conduct before Oct. 1, 2020.
- Take rules to the teacher or group leader, making sure they read the rules of the contest.
- SIZE DOES MATTER—check the rules for the minimum and maximum size limit.
- NO WORDS OR NUMBERS can be on the front of the poster.
- The contestant must be 11, 12, or 13 years of age on November 15, 2020.
- Standard peace symbols are allowed—peace symbol, 2 fingers up, peace dove, and olive branch.
- NOTHING CAN BE GLUED OR STAPLED TO THE POSTER—no glitter glue, no extra paper or objects. It cannot be mounted on anything, and must be able to be rolled into a tube for mailing.
- There must be an official Peace Poster Sticker (that comes in the kit) attached to the BACK LOWER RIGHT HAND CORNER of the poster. This sticker cannot be photocopied; it must be from a kit. Be sure this is filled out and signed by the parent of the child, as well as your president.
- Be sure that those who are judging your club's contest know the rules and the theme. Entering
 a poster that will be disqualified in the district contest is unfair to the other contestants in your
 contest that could have been a winner.
- If you would like a Powerpoint of last year's winners on the International level, send me an email and I will send it to you. angienick1945@gmail.com This could be beneficial to your teacher or leader to show the students what has won in the past.




